

SNARES ARE PROBABLY THE SIMPLEST TRAP TO SET AND, IN A SURVIVAL SITUATION, HAVING EVERY ADVANTAGE AVAILABLE IS ESSENTIAL. THE BASIC CONCEPT IS THAT THE ANIMAL IS CAUGHT IN A NOOSE. THE IDEA IS THAT THE INTENDED PREY WILL RUN HEAD-FIRST INTO THE NOOSE, AND IT WILL SLIP CLOSED AROUND ITS NECK.

INSTRUCTION MANUAL



HOW TO USE:



Identify an animal trail. These are paths that animals will frequent and often can be found around a common watering hole. Also, look for signs of activity like droppings and tracks.

Put gloves on before touching the snare or stake to keep any human scent from lingering on them. Attach one end of the snare wire to the stake and anchor the stake into the ground.



Adjust the snare loop, on the other end, according to the size of the small animal to be trapped: rabbits, 4"; squirrels, 5 to 6" and opossum, 5 to 6".

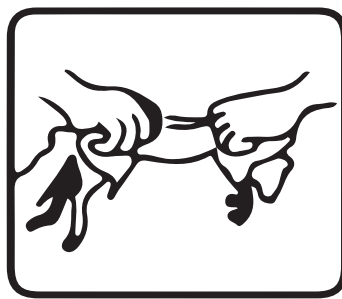
Secure a twig in the support coil to prop the snare up off of the ground the approximate head height of the intended prey: rabbits, 2"; squirrels, 2 to 3"; and opossum, 2".



HOW TO CLEAN GAME:



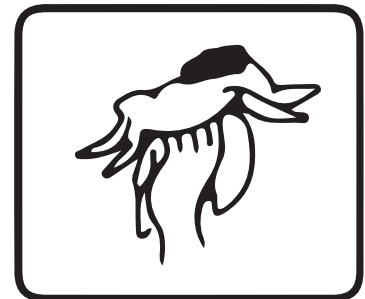
PICK LOOSE SKIN ON BACK AND CUT SLIT ACROSS THE BACK



GRASP HIDE ON BOTTOM SIDES AND PULL AWAY IN OPPOSITE DIRECTIONS



CUT OPEN ABDOMEN AND REMOVE ENTRAILS - CUT OFF HEAD AND LIMBS



WASH CARCASS AND DRY - KEEP COOL WHILE TRANSPORTING HOME

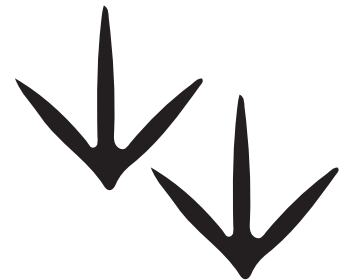
